#### Potted Histories...dreadful king, important legacy?

John inherited his brother's throne in 1199 and became the most powerful prince in Europe: King of England, Master of South Wales, Lord of Ireland, Duke of Normandy, Count of Anjou and Duke of Aquitaine, his empire stretching from the Scottish Border to the Pyrenees. Within no time at all he had lost almost everything in Europe and had stirred up a baronial rebellion in England that mercifully led to his death and a new way forward for England.

Youngest son of Henry II, John wasn't expected to be King or inherit very much and was nicknamed "Lackland". His first role, representing Henry in Ireland, ended in fiasco and retreat after upsetting the locals by making fun of their very long beards. Happy to fight when the odds were on his side, he quickly earned a reputation of running away when outnumbered. His nickname changed to "Softsword".

The tools of his trade were treachery, rebellion and murder-oppression on an unprecedented scale.

With brother Richard on the throne, but away at the Crusade and later held hostage, John attempted to set himself up as alternative King of England. Richard had previously bribed John to stay away but the unsettled situation encouraged John to chance his arm. He returned and fought against Richard's allies. At the same time John conspired with Richard's enemies in France to share out his lands there. He put it about that Richard was dead but when Richard returned all his treachery collapsed. Amazingly Richard actually forgave him. Lionheart became Bigheart! John was merely " a child who has had evil counsellors" John was 27 years of age.

The early years of John's reign were dominated also by warfare in France. His nephew Arthur claimed the throne too, and was supported by Philip of France. Matters meandered militarily around France until Arthur fell into John's grasp. One drunken night John personally murdered him and dumped him in the Seine, weighted down by a rock.

Over in England John's efforts were focused on strengthening the legal system and raising taxes. Both, he did with some energy and effectiveness. Those on the receiving end, including the Barons, were less than impressed. Tax rises to fund French wars, bad harvests and price inflation all led to increasing public unrest. John increasingly surrounded himself with loyal "New Men" at the expense of the traditional families,. He also withdrew many of the privileges the latter enjoyed. Known as sinfully lusty, cruel to his foes and lacking in piety himself, what on earth could go wrong? Before long John was in the middle of a civil war, with the French invading Southern England, and excommunicated by the Pope to boot.

A very significant episode at this time involved the Barons attempting to force John to agree to a new way of doing things—the Magna Carta. He eventually did in 1215 but neither side had much faith that it would be implemented. The fighting remained fierce and John had led a spirited campaign when in 1216 dysentery intervened which eventually killed him. His wish was to be buried at Beaulieu Abbey, which he had founded. This was now in enemy territory and so he was taken to Worcester Cathedral, which was available. Unusually he is buried without his crown which was lost probably somewhere in the Fens, with the Crown Jewels.

His legacy? Well he lost most of his French possessions which led to further wars. At home however, the Magna Carta, which he ignored in his lifetime, was available to his successor, Henry III and his supporters. This Great Charter thus became a cornerstone of both our own Constitution and that of the USA, centuries later. No great credit to John, except through his own failings. David Mussell.

#### "Last Seen Wearing" by Colin Dexter

I wish someone had told me that John Thaw's Morse is a pretty loose approximation to the real thing, because over the years I've avoided Colin Dexter's detective novels like the plague; I cannot take to the Thaw character, which is daft I know. Can't help it, I like Brenda Blethyn as Vera and I don't mind Dougie Henshall as Jimmy Perez in Shetland, even though he's physically nothing like the proper, swarthy Jimmy. It's something to do with Thaw being inextricably linked with "The Sweeney", to my mind anyway. But that's all been changed by a rather persuasive titian temptress, who wafted into the Hale Village Hall Library and seduced me into reading this book. I accepted it, not realising it was an Inspector Morse mystery – I wasn't really paying attention to the book to be honest, but I have found that I thoroughly enjoyed it (the book). The writer's detective is different to his onscreen persona, still a lover of the arts, but a bit earthy and more approachable. He's also more vulnerable, and less sullen than on television. I was smitten by Dexter's Morse within a few pages.

The plotline is simple; Morse is lumbered with the cold case of a missing teenage girl from more than 2 years previously. It has reignited after the original investigating officer is killed in a car accident, not suspicious on the face of it, but the officer had recently revisited the disappearance of the girl and his superior wants to know why, so a reluctant Morse is tasked to review the evidence. Like TV he is partnered with Sergeant Lewis; a chary counterpoint, making for an enjoyable tableau. There are Red Herrings aplenty, but instead of simply throwing them into the maelstrom, Dexter introduces the misdirection through the sleuth's train of thought, with Lewis's brooding disagreement simmering in the background. Morse is fallible. He becomes more despondent as each of his theories is abruptly debunked in the narrative. It's a clever technique - rather than leaving the reader adrift in a swirling shoal of slippery Herrings, it engenders a sympathetic appreciation of the detective's dilemma, and heightens one's growing sense of befuddlement. It's twisty, the clues are in there, but placed with subtlety, often by Morse himself, but he's too blinkered to realise.

Reading this *has* caused me another irritation about the TV show because he actually drives a Lancia, <u>not</u> a Jag. Why change? It's like giving Barbie Green Tights! Of course, as a member of the Lancia owners club, this imprecision is particularly nettling. Still, mustn't grumble too much, after all Kevin Whatley's "Lewis" is spot on whatever he's driving, probably a Ford.

## Minutes of the Hale Parish Council Meeting held on Tues 5<sup>th</sup> Nov 2024 at 7pm in Hale Village Hall (Downstairs)

Councillors Present: Councillors Donnell, Gemmell (Chair), Kyle and Vickery.

In attendance: The clerk, Cllr Janet Richards (NFDC) and Jacqui Hartas, Chair of Hale Village Hall Management Committee.

24.100 TO RECEIVE ANY APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: - Cllr Gillmon and Cllr Lavis.

**24.101 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** - To receive declarations of interest in respect of matters contained in this agenda (in accordance with the Localism Act 2011). None received.

#### **24.102 MINUTES**

24.102.1 It was unanimously RESOLVED to approve the minutes of the meeting held on 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2024.

24.102.2 Note matters arising from the minutes not elsewhere on the agenda.

**Proposed Exxon Pipeline** – The proposed pipeline to take CO2 from the Fawley plant to an off-shore carbon capture facility is no longer going ahead.

**24.103 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION** Jacqui Hartas spoke regarding the defibrillators situated at Hale Village Hall and Woodgreen Community Shop. Jacqui met with Suzie McNulty who manages the Woodgreen defibrillator, Suzie would like to restart the First Responder scheme next year for which volunteers would be needed. This was supported by Hale Parish Council although the council will not provide the lead on the project. Both defibrillators (Hale and Woodgreen) may need replacing in the next few years for which there may be grants available.

**24.104** HALE VILLAGE HALL: Jacqui Hartas (Chair of Hale Village Hall Management Committee) presented the plans to build an extension to the front of the Hall. This will contain a new accessible toilet which will be accessed from the entrance lobby. The current accessible toilet, to the back of the hall, will become a storage cupboard. The Village Hall committee will write to "serve notice" to the parish council which has agreed to permit building on Parish Council land. The Village Hall will apply for planning permission to carry out works in 2025.

24.90 PLANNING APPLICATION - To consider the response to the following applications.

Case Number 24/01114FULL

Proposal Oak framed single story extension

Site Romaine, The Old Post Office, HATCHET GREEN, HALE, SP6 2

Councillors discussed the application and **RESOLVED** to recommend Option 1 – PERMISSION but would accept the decision reached by the National Park Authority's Officers under their delegated powers. Cllrs agreed that the nature of the building may create significant light which should be taken into account by the National Park Planning Authority to reduce the light pollution on the "dark skies" of the National Park

#### 24.106 EXTERNAL MEETINGS: None attended.

**Clir Richards reported.** NFDC are holding an Emergency Planning Community Forum on 4<sup>th</sup> December (Clir Donnell to attend).

Community Infrastructure Levy Bids — The second round of grant funding is now available and bids can be made until 13<sup>th</sup> December. All community groups are eligible to apply for CIL funding for projects to enhance the infrastructure in the local area.

#### 24.107CONSULTATIONS:

**Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan** Cllr Vickery responded on behalf of Hale PC concentrating on the area local to Hale. The consultation closed on 3<sup>rd</sup> November.

**Remote Attendance and Proxy Voting** This consultation runs until 19<sup>th</sup> December and seeks views on allowing remote and hybrid attendance at meetings. Councillors agreed that this would serve to aid meetings going forward however would need to be carefully legislated, for example, include a minimum threshold of meetings which must be attended in person. The clerk will respond on behalf of HPC and all councillors are also able to respond individually.

**NFDC Parking Strategy Review** – This consultation is now live until 1st December and allows all residents to have their say on the future of parking in the NFDC car parks via www.newforest.gov.uk /ParkingConsultation.

**24.108 TREE SURVEY** - An NFDC Tree Officer recently surveyed the 4 large oaks next to the Village Hall and work is required to reduce one large oak. Two quotes were supplied by NFDC, the clerk will obtain a quote from a local company and the works will be carried out over the winter. The Service Level Agreement held with NFDC will be expanded to include the small copse next to the hall which will be surveyed every 4 years; the 4 large oaks adjacent to the hall will be surveyed every 2 years.

#### 24.109 VILLAGE MAINTENANCE:

The Lengthsman will be working in the village on 18<sup>th</sup> November, jobs will include mending the broken bench and cutting back vegetation.

The village car park and BOAT (leading down from the village hall) suffered due to recent torrential rains. It was **RESOLVED** to approve up to £500 to carry out remedial repairs, discussions regarding a more permanent solution, and its' funding, are ongoing.

#### 24.110 BANK ACCOUNTS:

From 14<sup>th</sup> Jan 2025 Lloyds bank is changing the Treasurer's Account to a new Community Account, this account will incur charges of 4.25 per month.

## Patients recovering from burns or reconstructive surgery can shower comfortably in new Stars Appeal funded wet room

Patients recovering from severe burns or trauma that limit their mobility have a new wet room where they can wash more independently in a comfortable, private space, thanks to the Stars Appeal, Salisbury Hospital's Charity. The £40,000 wet room on Odstock Burns and Plastics Ward at Salisbury District Hospital includes a walk-in shower and is accessible for wheelchairs and other mobility aids, helping patients recovering from severe burns or reconstructive surgery to adjust to a new personal care routine with privacy and dignity.

Patient Craig Winspear, who was treated at the Hospital for sepsis in his leg, was the first person to use the new wet room. He said: "It was fantastic to get into a nice shower after being bedbound. Being able to have a proper wash was amazing in itself. Having a wet room like this with lots of space where I can move around more comfortably made all the difference. I was also able to have my music playing which made it feel more like home." Craig, who was in the Army for 10 years, lost both his legs after an improvised explosive device went off while he was serving in Afghanistan. He adds: "Being a double amputee it's great to be able to relax in a bath after spending time in a hospital bed. Some people can be bedbound for quite a long time so when they are able to have a proper shower it's a big thing – it gives you your independence and boosts your morale. A simple thing as a shower is something that people take for granted. Thank you to the brilliant donors who have helped fund this!"

The new wet room can be used by patients in specialist shower beds. As well as helping patients on the ward, burns patients coming in for clinic appointments now have a private bathroom where they can remove their bandages and dressings and have a shower before having new dressings put on.

Senior Sister on Odstock Ward, Hazel Jackson, explains how the new facility is enhancing care for their patients: "This wet room is a huge benefit for all our patients. The walk-in shower is fully accessible to everyone, including wheelchair users, people who need to sit when they shower, and even patients who need to stay on their bed. Many of our burns and plastic surgery patients need daily showers as part of their treatment and some rooms on the ward don't have a shower so we had to move patients around the ward. Now we can offer all of our inpatients and outpatients better treatment with these new facilities. "The wet room is big enough to comfortably fit patients in their wheelchairs and still have room for staff members to help them with showering and their dressings when needed. Our patients now have a private washing space which also helps them to be more independent. A huge thank you to everyone who supports the Stars Appeal and make projects like this possible."

The Stars Appeal, Salisbury Hospital's Charity, aims to raise £1million every year to fund new equipment, enhancements to buildings, and ongoing projects supporting patients across Salisbury Hospital. To find out more visit <a href="https://www.starsappeal.org">www.starsappeal.org</a>





#### Fordingbridge Museum celebrates its silver anniversary.

Fordingbridge Museum had its origins in the private collection of local builder and undertaker John Shering. John's 12-year-old daughter Mary had asked him what a gin trap was and, horrified by her lack of knowledge about such things, he started to collect



items to teach her about her heritage. The collection soon outgrew his home and he had to house it in a special building in his builder's yard off Church Street. In 2000 he and his brother Richard donated the collection to the town and so Fordingbridge museum as we know it today was born.

Next year will be our silver anniversary and over the 1st to 3rd August we will be celebrating 25 years of serving the town of Fordingbridge.

It was only in the 17<sup>th</sup> century that the term museum was used to describe a collection of curiosities that were owned by private individuals. One such person was Elias Ashmole who donated his collection to Oxford University stipulating that it should be housed in a purpose-built museum. The Ashmolean Museum was opened to the public in 1683 and is acknowledged to be the first museum in the sense we know it today. It was intended, "not only for the inspection and entertainment of the learned and curious but for the general use of and benefit of the public."

Many aristocrats had private collections of curiosities which they kept in cabinets and which they showed only to their most intimate friends. The core collection of the British Museum, founded in 1759, was the Cabinet of William Courten which had been purchased by Sir Hans Sloane in 1701.

There was a rapid expansion in museums in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. This reflected the increase in civic pride and later in the century the promotion of free education. Public access was increased by the development of gas and electric lighting which enabled the working classes to visit in the evenings. During the 20<sup>th</sup> century, museums were increasingly seen, not just as centres of excellence but also as something that could make a positive contribution to the local economy. Specialist museums like the Imperial War Museum and museums such as The Weald and Downland Open Air Museum near Chichester spawned many similar smaller local museums.



Housed in an old granary, Fordingbridge Museum is a major tourist attraction for the town and a valuable resource for local people. It is run entirely by volunteers and financed by visitor donations and fundraising. Everyone who works for the museum is immensely proud of what we have achieved over the last quarter of a century. The thousands of visitors we have every year have significantly contributed to the economy and vibrancy of the town. We host local schools, cubs and scouts, we provide individualised tours round the museum and the

town, we publish articles on historical topics and give talks to local organisations. By engaging with local people, we have enhanced the wonderful community spirit of the town and surrounding villages. Please make a note in your diary of our anniversary celebrations over 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> August and help us commemorate the museum and its role in Fordingbridge. Keep an eye out next year for information about the exciting events that we are planning.

As we approach Christmas my advice to you is to put your hope in God and in his Son Jesus Christ. He alone can give meaning, purpose and hope to our lives, and his kingdom of love, peace and truth will last for ever. And, if we trust in Him and ask him to do so then, when our time comes, he will take us to be with him, to his eternal heavenly home, where that Kingdom of love and peace that we all long for will finally be ours.

And so I end by wishing you and your family a blessed Christmas, and an eternity of peace, love and joy.
